CALL FOR RESEARCH PROPOSALS AY 2020-2021

The UST Research Center on Social Science and Education (RCSSED) announces its Call for Proposals for the RCSSED Research Grant Project (RRGP) covering Academic Year (AY) 2020-2021.

Eligibility

RRGP is open to all Thomasian faculty members who are:

(1) Tenured and (2) with at least a Master's degree and pursuing doctorate degree

Disciplinal Thrusts

Research proposals should fall under two major RCSSED disciplinal thrusts, namely, (a) social sciences; and (b) education. Specific disciplinal fields of study of current RCSSED researchers include: Anthropology, Business, Communication, Economics, Education, Environmental Science, Languages, Politics, Psychology, Social Development, Social Sciences, and Sociology. This current list of disciplines is expected to grow under the RRGP.

Research Interest Groups (RIG)

RRGP is composed of research interest groups (RIG) headed by a *RIG Leader*. Identified *RIG Leaders* plans and spearheads RIG's activities and monitor the research project under their interest group.

Current Research Interest Groups

For Social Science: Life Course and Intergenerational Studies, Business Studies, Sustainability Studies, Psychology Studies, Language Studies, Community-Engaged Studies, Studies on Church and Social Issues, Social Health Studies, Politics and Public Policy

For Education: Educational and Leadership Studies (including transnational education, Shadow Education, Teacher Education, Studies on K to 12, academe-industry partnership)

Requirements for Application

Applicants should prepare three requirements:

- 1. A **letter of intent** endorsed by the Dean and noted by the Department Chair/Disciplinal Coordinator. The letter should clearly stipulate disciplinal background, research interest, intended RIG to work under, and rationale on how RCSSED may assist the applicant in pursuing a research career in the university.
- 2. **Curriculum vitae** (following RCSSED format/template)
- 3. A **full-blown research proposal** with the following parts:
 - a. Title of the study
 - b. Name of Proponent / Affiliation
 - c. Indicative Abstract
 - d. Rationale of the Study / Significance of the Study
 - e. Research Objectives / Research Questions / Research Hypothesis
 - f. Theoretical Background (Theoretical Framework & Literature Review)
 - g. Research Simulacrum / Conceptual Framework (if any)
 - h. Method
 - i. References
 - j. Gantt Chart / Timetable
 - k. Line-item budget

Research load allocation for successful applicants will be according to the following research load guidelines:

Note:

- Additional load for funded researches will depend upon the amount of grant and the number of researchers in the research project
- Final research load be awarded by the Research Center Director and approved by VRRI.
- Amount of research funds will depend upon the nature of research
- ➤ Determination of research load allocation will be based on the results of the *Research Performance Review* (RPR) and *Research Proposal Evaluation* (RPE).







RRGP Guidelines

- 1. Applicants are expected to prepare the three requirements and secure the necessary endorsement from the Dean with the knowledge of the Department Chair/Disciplinal Coordinator.
- 2. Application documents should be in two formats—print and electronic versions.
- 3. Applicants are encouraged to personally submit application documents to the RCSSED office on or before the submission dates. Make sure to prepare a duplicate copy to serve as the applicant's receiving copy for documentation purposes.
- 4. Submitted applications will be evaluated by the RCSSED director and the RRGP Evaluation Board for enrichment.
- 5. Applicants will be notified of the decision of the RRGP Evaluation Board as soon as evaluation is completed.

Evaluation and Enhancement Process

- 1. The competitive evaluation of eligible proposals will be undertaken by the Research Center Director and RRGP Evaluation Board comprising of designated disciplinal leads, one research expert and another content expert.
- 2. Review criteria includes:
 - a. Contribution to New Knowledge and to the Society.
 - i. Aligned to the research agenda of the University
 - ii. Aligned to the Sustainable Development Goals, Philippine Development Plan and DOST Priority Areas
 - b. *Academic significance* of the project contributes to the applicant's disciplinal expertise as this has potential to advance his/her professional development specifically in the realm of research career, engagement, and excellence.
 - c. *Quality of the proposal* reflects the applicant's deep knowledge and disciplinal familiarity with the proposed research focus, methods, theories, procedures, and implications.
 - d. Intended outcomes of the proposal are clear, sufficient, and feasible.
 - e. **Budget allocation** is appropriate to the proposed project.
